Face to Face Supports

- Drop-in and appointment support in math, science, writing, study skills, and basic Microsoft Office/Canvas skills.
- Peer Tutoring—Up to 1 hr/course/week of free tutoring by a student who has recently completed the course with a B+ or higher. May be individual or small group format. Tutoring not available for all courses. Contact the Learning Cafe for more information.

Online Supports

- Appointments (via phone, Skype, Teams, Zoom or other conferencing tools)
- eLearning Café—24/7 resources on eLearning and technology, study skills, writing and research, and math and science.
- Writing Dropbox—asynchronous writing feedback, usually within 3 business days.
 Access from eLearning Café or Learning Café homepage, or the Hive.
- Embedded Strategist—an Academic Strategist responds to writing or study skills questions on your Canvas discussion board.

Creative Review of Prior Classes

Work with students to create a mind map summary of the previous class.

Share What Successful Students Do

Provide examples of strategies that successful students use to perform well in your course or on a challenging task or project. Add reminders at key points during the term.

Skill Building Activities

Pose a question and give 5 minutes to find the answer in class readings. Students discuss reading strategies used to find the answer. Instructor could use a concrete, specific (scan and find) question one time and a more conceptual (synthesize) question the next time.

Model How to Map a Chapter/Unit

Demonstrate how to use headings and subheadings in the chapter to map connections between concepts.

Promote Available Resources

Refer students to academic and social support resources on and off campus.




A LA CARTE
