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Methodology

Population: The province of Alberta has a total population of 4,334,025 residents (Statistics Canada, 2018) approximately 78% of which are 18 years of age or older for an adult population of 3,380,540.

Sample: Data were collected by Lethbridge College students in the fall of 2018. Students interviewed 1,364 adult Alberta residents by telephone from September 29 to October 4, 2018 under the supervision of principal investigator Dr. Faron Ellis, Research Chair, Citizen Society Research Lab. Landline/hybrid telephone numbers were selected from a sample drawn from InfoGroup directories and supplemented with a selection of mobile numbers from CSRL lists. Representativeness: Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the province of Alberta. The sample has been statistically weighted where necessary to even better reflect the demographic distribution of the population (gender, area of province and age).

Confidence: The weighted sample yields a margin of error ± 2.65 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data (Calgary ± 5.1 percentage points, Edmonton and immediate area ± 5.1 percentage points, North ± 5.6 percentage points, South ± 5.6 percentage points 19 times out of 20).

IB Commons Call Centre: Students conducted interviews using the facilities of the Lethbridge College IB Commons Call Centre. We thank members of Lethbridge College's ITS and AV teams for their support in helping maintain the IB Commons Call Center.

Sponsorship: These data are part of a larger study of the opinions and attitudes of Alberta residents conducted by the Citizen Society Research Lab at Lethbridge College. These questions were derived from student and faculty interest in the topics.

Executive Summary: Massage Therapy in Alberta

As part of our ongoing analysis of public opinion in Alberta, the Citizen Society Research Lab at Lethbridge College incorporates items of community interest into our omnibus surveys of the adult Alberta population. In the fall of 2016 we included a series of questions of interest to our massage therapy students and faculty. We repeated several of those questions in 2017, and again in 2018. Below is a brief, initial analysis of the results.

Relaxation Massage

- More than one of every three adult Albertans (31.5%) received relaxation massage services in the past twelve months (over one million Albertans), up considerable from only about one-quarter (24.5%) in 2016 and 28.7% in 2017. No significant regional differences are measured.

Therapeutic Massage

- More than one-third of Albertans (35.4%) received therapeutic massage services in the past twelve months (well over one-million Albertans.) Again, no significant regional variations are measured.

Awareness of Unregulated Professional Status of Massage Therapy Services in Alberta

- A substantial majority of Albertans (61.9%) were not aware of the unregulated professional status of the Alberta massage therapy industry.

Support for the Establishment of an Alberta College of Massage Therapists

- The vast majority of Albertans (92.1%) support the establishment of an Alberta college of massage therapists.

Support for Required Entrance to Practice Exam

- The vast majority of Albertans (91.8%) support requiring those wishing to practice massage therapy to pass an entrance to practice exam.

Relaxation Massage

Received relaxation massage services in past 12 months

More than one of every three adult Albertans (31.5%) received relaxation massage services in the past twelve months (over one million Albertans), up considerable from only about one-quarter (24.5%) in 2016 and 28.7% in 2017. No significant regional differences are measured, although Calgarians (37.1%) are most likely to have received relaxation massage services in the past year.

- Women (35.9%) are more likely than men (27.3%) to have received a relaxation massage in the past year.
- Middle-income residents (38.7%) are more likely than are upper (33.7%) and especially lower-income (26.3%) residents to have received relaxation massage services.
- Seniors (17.1%) and those with the least amount of formal education (26.9%) are among the least likely to receive relaxation massage services.

Therapeutic Massage

Received therapeutic massage services in past 12 months

More than one-third of Albertans (35.4%) received therapeutic massage services in the past twelve months (well over one-million Albertans.)

- Again, no significant regional variations are measured, however Calgarians (37.7%) and northern Albertans (37.0%) are slightly more likely than are other Albertans to have received therapeutic massage services in the past year.
- Women (39.0%) considerably more likely than men (31.4%) to receive therapeutic massage services.
- Likelihood of receiving therapeutic massage services increases with income. Nearly half (46.2%) of upper-income Albertans received therapeutic massage services last year while only one-quarter of lower-income residents (26.2%) did likewise.
- Middle-aged Albertans, particularly those aged 30 to 44 (46.7%) are more likely than are seniors (24.6%) or the youth (31.1%) to receive therapeutic massage services.

Awareness of Unregulated Professional Status of Massage Therapy Services in Alberta

A substantial majority of Albertans (61.9%) are not aware of the unregulated professional status of massage therapy in Alberta.

- No significant regional differences in awareness are measured, nor are significant demographic differences apparent. Awareness has also not been increasing over time, with approximately the same proportion of Albertans reporting awareness in each of the three years we have measured this item.
- The most significant differences in awareness are between those who had received massage services in the past year and those who had not. Those who received both relaxation massage (44.0%) and therapeutic massage (45.0%) are more aware than those who had not received relaxation (35.4%) or therapeutic massage services (34.3%).

Support for the Establishment of an Alberta College of Massage Therapists

As is clear from the data below and the expanded tables on the following page, the vast majority of Albertans (92.1%) support the establishment of an Alberta college of massage therapists. Most of those, and a clear majority of all Albertans (59.3%) are strongly supportive with the remainder (32.9%) somewhat supportive. Few Albertans are somewhat opposed (5.0%), and fewer still are strongly opposed (2.9%).

- No significant regional differences in support levels are apparent. Nor are there differences in opinion between those who have or who have not received massage services in the past year.
- Women (94.6%) are more universally supportive than are men (89.8%).

Support for Required Entrance to Practice Exams

It is clear from the data below and the expanded tables on the following page that the vast majority of Albertans (91.8%) support requiring those wishing to practice massage therapy to pass an entrance to practice exam. Most of those, and a clear majority of all Albertans (66.5%) are strongly supportive with the remainder (25.4%) somewhat supportive. Few Albertans are somewhat opposed (4.6%) and fewer still are strongly opposed (3.6%).

- No significant regional differences in support levels are measured. Nor are there significant differences in opinion between those who have or have not received massage services in the past year.
- Women (94%) are more universally supportive than are men (89.8%).

Questions

Thinking for a moment about massage therapy services in Alberta. Massage therapy is the manual manipulation of soft body tissues to enhance a person's health and well-being. While there are several types of massage, two general categories are *relaxation massage* and *therapeutic massage*. Relaxation Massage is most often practiced in settings like spas, wellness centers and resorts, Therapeutic Massage, also known as deep tissue, medical, or clinical massage, is practiced in settings like clinics, hospitals and chiropractic offices.

- Please tell me if you have received relaxation massage services in the past 12 months?
- Have you received therapeutic massage treatment in the past 12 months?

Massage Therapy is not a regulated profession in Alberta because there is no governing association that enforces standards of practices, codes of ethics, and training requirements, as do the 30 Alberta health professional regulatory bodies such as the Alberta College of Physicians and Surgeons, the Alberta College of Dietitians, or the Alberta College of Physical Therapists.

- Please tell me if, before today, you were aware that massage therapy is not a regulate profession in Alberta?
- Please tell me whether you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose or strongly oppose the establishment of an Alberta College of Massage Therapists that would govern the standards of practices, codes of ethics, and training requirements of massage therapists in Alberta.

Because massage therapy is not a regulated profession, massage therapists are not required to take and pass an entrance exam prior to practicing massage therapy (often called entrance to practice exam or professional standards exam)

- Please tell me how much you support or oppose massage therapists being required to take an entrance to practice exam?
