#### Methodology



Population The city of Lethbridge has a total population of 77,202 residents (2005 municipal census) approximately 79% of which are 18 years of age or older (61,250 est.). A total of 37,546 residents are male (48.6%) while 39,656 are female (51.4%). South Lethbridge is home to 27,894 residents (36.1%) while the rapidly expanding west side is now home to 26,407 residents (34.2%). There are 22,911 north Lethbridge residents (29.7%).



Sample Data were collected by Lethbridge Community College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 - Social Science Research Methods at Lethbridge Community College in the fall of 2005. Students interviewed 584 adult residents of the city of Lethbridge on October 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> 2005 by telephone using the Western Wats Lethbridge call center facility. Telephone numbers were selected using random predictive dialing from a sample drawn from the Telus Superpages. We sincerely thank Western Wats for their hospitality.



Representativeness Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted where necessary to even better reflect the demographic distribution of the population (gender and area of the city).



Confidence The weighted sample yields a margin of error of  $\pm$  4%, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data.

# Foreign Investment in Lethbridge



An overwhelming majority of Lethbridge residents (94.3%) believe that foreign investment is important for the Canadian economy. Women (95.9%), upper-income residents (97.2%) and younger residents are most likely to think foreign investment is important for Canada.



A slightly smaller, but still large majority of residents (87.3%) believe foreign investment is important for the Lethbridge economy. Women (89.7%), west Lethbridge residents (90.2%), middle-income earners (89.0%), university grads (89.9%) and gen-xers (90.0%) are most likely to think foreign investment is important.

The majority of Lethbridge residents (57.5%) believe American investment and investment from other countries to be equally beneficial to the Lethbridge economy. Slightly more than one-in-five Lethbridge residents (22.2%) believe American foreign investment to be more beneficial to the Lethbridge economy than investment from other countries. A similar number (20.3%) believe investment from other countries is more beneficial than is American investment.




Men (25.0%) are slightly more likely to believe that American Foreign investment is more beneficial than are women (19.7%). North Lethbridge residents (24.2%), lower-income residents (26.8%), those with the least amount of formal education (29.6%) and boomers (26.7%) are most likely to believe American investment is more beneficial than is investment from other countries.

#### Foreign Investment in Lethbridge



Strong support (85.9%) also exists for foreign investors owning and operating the company but using Canadian managers to run the business in Lethbridge. Men (89.9%), west Lethbridge residents (89.8%), upper-income earners (89.9%), university grads (91.4%) and gen-exers (92.5%) are most supportive.

Most Lethbridge residents (77.7%) are opposed to foreign investment in situations where the foreign investors own, operate and use foreign managers to run the business in Lethbridge. Women (82.1%), north Lethbridge residents (82.8%), college-tech-trade grads (87.3%) and boomers (85.9%) are most opposed.

A majority of Lethbridge residents (68.2%) believe that the community of Lethbridge would be accepting of more foreign workers. West Lethbridge residents (65.2%) and gen-xers (57.6%) are slightly less likely to believe Lethbridge will be accepting of more foreign workers.

Most Lethbridge residents (80.7%) state that they will personally be accepting of more foreign workers. West Lethbridge residents (84.6%), upper-income earners (85.3%), university grads (89.4%) and the youth (84.0%) are the most accepting.
