2004 Lethbridge Public Opinion Study (Fall)

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City of Lethbridge

Located in southwestern Alberta, the city of Lethbridge is home to 72,717 residents, 57,674 of which are 18 years of age or older.



The city is divided into six census areas, two each for its South, North and West geographic areas. It is divided north and south by Alberta highway 3, and east west by the Oldman River.

South Lethbridge's 27,941 residents represent 38.4 of the city's total population. West Lethbridge (22,429) and north Lethbridge (22,347) represent 30.8 and 30.7 respectively.

Methodology

This report is based on data collected by Lethbridge Community College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 – Social Science Research Methods at Lethbridge Community College in the fall of 2004. Students interviewed 508 adult residents on October 2nd and 3rd, 2004 by telephone using the Western Wats Lethbridge call center facility. Telephone numbers were selected using random digit predictive dialing.

The weighted sample yields a margin of error of \pm 4.3%, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data.

Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the voting age population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted where necessary to even better reflect the demographic distribution of the population.

These data are part of a larger study of the opinions and attitudes of Lethbridge residents conducted by the Citizen Society Research Lab at LCC. The questions originated from student interests in the issues. This report has been prepared for Global Television (Lethbridge) and the Calgary Herald. We thank Global and the Herald for their interest in our research.

What follows is a selection of our findings based on the questions below.


- Q. Which of the following you are most likely to vote for in the upcoming election for Lethbridge mayor.
- Q. How would you rate the overall performance of Mayor Bob Tarleck over the past three years?
- Q. How would you rate the overall performance of Alderman Joe Mauro over the past three years?
- Q. How would you rate the overall performance of the Lethbridge City Council over the past three years?
- Q. How likely are you to vote in the upcoming elections for Lethbridge mayor and council?

Mayoralty Election

Two weeks prior to the municipal elections, incumbent mayor Bob Tarleck enjoyed a wide lead in voter support (54.2%) over challenger Joe Mauro (21.1%). Almost one-quarter of all potential voters (24.6%) were undecided.

Tarleck's lead is consistent across all demographic categories and, most importantly, he enjoys 63.2% support among those most likely to vote. Mauro holds 23.3% support among those most likely to vote while 13.4% remain undecided.

Tarleck's support is strongest among upperincome voters (63.3%), university graduates (67.8%), and older voters (61.3% for boomers and 62.2% among seniors). Mauro receives his greatest support in south Lethbridge (25.5%), from college grads (24.3%) and gen-Xers (25.8%).



Tarleck Performance

Mayor Tarleck continues to receive very positive performance evaluations with 71.4% of those who offered an opinion stating he is doing a good job as Lethbridge mayor. Only 4.4% stated he is doing a poor job while 24.2% believe he is performing adequately.

Interestingly, only 9.8% of all respondents did not offer an evaluation of the Mayor's performance. These respondents have been excluded from the tables that follow. Tarleck receives his most positive evaluations from those most likely to vote (75.8%), university grads (75.9%) and seniors (85.1%).

Overall, Tarleck is evaluated more positively than is the Lethbridge city council as a whole.

Mauro Performance

Alderman Joe Mauro also enjoys very positive performance evaluations (61.1%) from respondents who were willing to offer an opinion. Almost one-third (31.7%) stated that he had performed adequately over the last term as a Lethbridge alderman while 7.2% stated he performed poorly.

Importantly, 25.2% of all respondents stated that they did not know how to evaluate alderman Mauro's performance. These respondents have been excluded from further analysis. Mauro receives his most positive evaluations from south Lethbridge residents (66.7%), lower income residents (65.4%) and seniors (66.1%).

Overall, Mauro is evaluated more positively than is the Lethbridge city council as a whole.

Council Performance

The outgoing Lethbridge city council also positive continues eniov to overall evaluations. performance Half the of respondents who offered an evaluation (50%) stated council had done a good job over the past three years. A further 31.7% stated council has performed adequately while 7.2% stated it has performed poorly.

These performance evaluations represent good news for aldermanic incumbents who are seeking reelection.

Council receives its most positive evaluations from those most likely to vote (56.7%), university grads (60.5%) and seniors (61.8%).

Likelihood of Voting

When asked about their likelihood of casting ballots in the upcoming municipal elections, only 51.4% of respondents stated that they would definitely vote. A further 18.9% stated they are very likely to vote while 29.8% stated that they were less likely or definitely not planning on voting.


These results follow familiar patters that have been measured when analyzing federal and provincial voter turnout trends.

Lower-income voters (37.8%) are much less likely to state they would definitely vote than

are middle-income (50.9%) and upper-income voters (60.3%). University grads are also among the most likely to state that they will cast ballots (70.1%).

Most disturbingly, but not surprisingly, Lethbridge youth are the least likely to state they will definitely vote.

Only 18.4% of those who are 18-29 years old told us they would definitely cast ballots. Seniors (73.1%) and boomers (68.1%) are the most likely state that they will definitely cast ballots.
