

Opinion on Six Policy Items

Lethbridge Public Opinion Study – Winter 2012

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Methodology

- Population The city of Lethbridge has a total population of 87,882 residents (2011 census) approximately 80% of which are 18 years of age or older (70,305). A total of 43,011 Lethbridge residents are male (48.9%) while 44,871 are female (51.1%). South Lethbridge is home to 30,504 residents (34.7%) while the rapidly expanding west side is now home to 32,063 residents (36.5%). There are 25,315 north Lethbridge residents (28.8%). Coaldale has a total population of 6,943 residents (2009 census).
- Sample Data Collected by Lethbridge College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 Social Science Research Methods in the winter of 2012. Students interviewed 738 randomly selected, adult Lethbridge and Coaldale residents by telephone on February 11–12, 2012 under the supervision of School of Liberal Arts faculty member Faron Ellis. Telephone numbers were selected from a sample drawn from InfoCanada directories. We sincerely appreciate and thank all those who took time to respond to our survey. - Representativeness Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted to even better reflect that of the population (gender, age and area of the city of Lethbridge).
- Confidence The weighted sample yields a margin of error of ± 3.6 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data. For example, the Lethbridge subsample margin of error is ± 3.9 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, while the Coaldale subsample has a margin of error of ± 9.5 percentage points 19 times out of 20.

Social Issues

Same-sex Marriage

A clear majority of Lethbridge residents (68.3%) continue to support same-sex marriages having equal legal status with traditional marriages. Support for same-sex marriages has increased significantly from only 33.5% in 2002 when we first asked Lethbridge residents about this issue. Women (71.8%), the least religious (80.3%), the youth (79.6%) and those with a university education (76.4%) are among the most supportive. Religion, age and education remain the most important predictors of opinion on this issue. Coaldale residents are only slightly less supportive (67.6%) than are Lethbridge residents. Opinion is also divided along partisan lines with Wildrose supporters most opposed (50.9%). However, substantial majorities of PC (61.9%), Liberal (79.1%) and NDP supporters (96.1%) are supportive.

Abortion Choice

Substantial majorities of Lethbridge (77.0%) and Coaldale residents (70.6%) support a woman's right to choose to have an abortion. Men (80.7%) are just as supportive as are women (73.0%). Furthermore, substantial majorities in most demographic categories demonstrate strong support. Religion is the most important determent of opinion on this issue with a slight majority of the most religious opposed (51.0%). Support climbs to 89.9% among the least religious. Significant partisan differences are measured on this issue with PC (76.5%) and Wildrose (60.2%) partisans less supportive than Liberal (83.6%) and NDP (92.0%) partisans, although strong majorities of all provincial partisans are supportive.

Capital Punishment

Majorities of both Lethbridge (57.4%) and Coaldale residents (63.3%) support Canada reintroducing capital punishment for people convicted of first degree murder. Support is strongest in north Lethbridge (59.8%), among those with the least amount of formal education (73.3%), seniors (66.1%) and PC (66.0%) and Wildrose (68.5%) supporters. Opposition is strongest amongst university graduates (57.0%), the youth (63.2%) and provincial NDP partisans (74.8%).

Legal Medical Marijuana

Substantial majorities of Lethbridge (74.3%) and Coaldale residents (76.5%) support marijuana being legal for medical purposes. Support is strongest with upper income residents (83.7%), university grads (79.6%), and boomers (83.5%).

Decriminalize Recreational Marijuana

Approximately two in every five Lethbridge (38.7%) and Coaldale residents (36.7%) support decriminalizing marijuana for recreational purposes. Support is strongest among men (45.4%), the least religious (49.5%), university graduates (44.9%), and provincial Liberal (50.9%) and NDP (52.4%) supporters.

Legalize Doctor-Assisted Suicide

Majorities of Lethbridge (66.5%) and Coaldale residents (63.8%) support making doctor-assisted suicide legal in Canada. Religion is the most important predictor of opinion with 85.8% of the least religious respondents supportive while a substantial majority of the highly religious is opposed (66.2%).
