## Opinion on Six Policy Items

## Lethbridge Public Opinion Study - Winter 2013

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## Methodology

( Population The city of Lethbridge has a total population of 89,074 residents ( 2012 census) approximately $80 \%$ of which are 18 years of age or older ( 71,260 ). A total of 43,011 Lethbridge residents are male ( $48.9 \%$ ) while 44,871 are female ( $51.1 \%$ ). South Lethbridge is home to 30,795 residents ( $34.5 \%$ ) while the rapidly expanding west side is now home to 32,847 residents $(36.9 \%)$. There are 25,432 north Lethbridge residents ( $28.6 \%$ ). Coaldale has a total population of 7,493 residents (2011 census).
(. Sample Data Collected by Lethbridge College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 - Social Science Research Methods in the winter of 2013. Students interviewed 835 randomly selected, adult Lethbridge and Coaldale residents by telephone on February 9-10, 2013 under the supervision of School of Liberal Arts faculty members Faron Ellis and Marda Schindeler. Telephone numbers were selected from a sample drawn from InfoCanada directories. We sincerely appreciate and thank all those who took time to respond to our survey. (. Representativeness Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted to even better reflect that of the population (gender, age and area of the city of Lethbridge).
( Confidence The weighted sample yields a margin of error of $\pm 3.4$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20 . The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data. For example, the Lethbridge subsample margin of error is $\pm 3.6$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20 , while the Coaldale subsample has a margin of error of $\pm 9.8$ percentage points 19 times out of 20.
( . IB Commons Call Centre Students conducted interviews using the facilities of the Lethbridge College IB Commons Call Centre and applications originally developed by the Dr. James Manis of the Open Source Learning Lab.
(. Sponsorship These data are part of a larger study of the opinions and attitudes of Lethbridge residents conducted by the Citizen Society Research Lab at Lethbridge College. This particular question was derived from student and faculty interest in the topics.

## Policy Issues

## ( . Same-sex Marriage

A clear majority of Lethbridge (71.5\%) and Coaldale residents (63.1\%) continue to support same-sex marriages having equal legal status with traditional marriages. Support for same-sex marriages has increased significantly from only $33.5 \%$ in 2002 when we first asked Lethbridge residents about this issue. Women ( $75.2 \%$ ), the nonreligious ( $85.2 \%$ ), younger residents and university graduates ( $78.3 \%$ ) are among the most supportive. Religion, age and education remain the most important predictors of opinion on this issue. Opinion is also divided along partisan lines with Wildrose voters least supportive (56.3\%). More substantial majorities of PC (66.7\%), Liberal (82.4\%) and NDP supporters (85.7\%) are supportive.

## ( Abortion Choice

Substantial majorities of Lethbridge ( $81.2 \%$ ) and Coaldale residents ( $62.8 \%$ ) support a woman's right to choose to have an abortion. Men (81.1\%) are just as supportive as are women ( $79.3 \%$ ). Furthermore, substantial majorities in most demographic categories demonstrate strong support. Religion is the most important determent of opinion on this issue with a slight majority of the most religious supportive (50.4\%). Support climbs to $94.3 \%$ among the nonreligious. Only minor partisan differences are evident with PC (76.1\%) and Wildrose (80.4\%) partisans only slightly less supportive than Liberal ( $85.6 \%$ ) and NDP ( $87.5 \%$ ) partisans, although strong majorities of all provincial partisans are supportive.
(. Capital Punishment

Majorities of both Lethbridge (66.2\%) and Coaldale residents (76.1\%) support Canada reintroducing capital punishment for people convicted of first degree murder. Education and provincial partisanship are the most important determinants of opinion on this issue. Majorities of university grads (53.7\%) and NDP voters (67.0\%) are opposed while substantial majorities of PC ( $75.6 \%$ ) and Wildrose ( $80.4 \%$ ) voters are supportive.
( Legal Medical Marijuana
Substantial majorities of Lethbridge (79.5\%) and Coaldale residents (65.0\%) support marijuana being legal for medical purposes. Although strong majorities in all demographic categories are supportive, support is tempered amongst the most religious (61.6\%) and seniors (69.3\%).
(. Decriminalize Recreational Marijuana

More than two in every five Lethbridge ( $42.0 \%$ ) and Coaldale residents ( $42.7 \%$ ) support decriminalizing marijuana for recreational purposes. Support is strongest among men (47.7\%), upper income residents (51.4\%), the nonreligious (56.5\%), baby boomers (50.8\%), and NDP voters (65.5\%).

A Legalize Doctor-Assisted Suicide
Substantial majorities of Lethbridge (74.4\%) and Coaldale residents (75.7\%) support making doctor-assisted suicide legal in Canada. Religion is the most important predictor of opinion with $88.4 \%$ of the nonreligious respondents supportive while a majority of the highly religious is opposed (56.1\%).
