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Methodology



- Population The city of Lethbridge has a total population of 89,074 residents (2012 census) approximately 80% of which are 18 years of age or older (71,260). A total of 43,011 Lethbridge residents are male (48.9%) while 44,871 are female (51.1%). South Lethbridge is home to 30,795 residents (34.5%) while the rapidly expanding west side is now home to 32,847 residents (36.9%). There are 25,432 north Lethbridge residents (28.6%). Coaldale has a total population of 7,493 residents (2011 census).
- Sample Data Collected by Lethbridge College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 Social Science Research Methods in the winter of 2013. Students interviewed 835 randomly selected, adult Lethbridge and Coaldale residents by telephone on February 9–10, 2013 under the supervision of School of Liberal Arts faculty members Faron Ellis and Marda Schindeler. Telephone numbers were selected from a sample drawn from InfoCanada directories. We sincerely appreciate and thank all those who took time to respond to our survey. - Representativeness Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted to even better reflect that of the population (gender, age and area of the city of Lethbridge).
- Confidence The weighted sample yields a margin of error of ± 3.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data. For example, the Lethbridge subsample margin of error is ± 3.6 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, while the Coaldale subsample has a margin of error of ± 9.8 percentage points 19 times out of 20.
- IB Commons Call Centre Students conducted interviews using the facilities of the Lethbridge College IB Commons Call Centre and applications originally developed by the Dr. James Manis of the Open Source Learning Lab.
- Sponsorship These data are part of a larger study of the opinions and attitudes of Lethbridge residents conducted by the Citizen Society Research Lab at Lethbridge College. Executive Summary

Perceptions of Lethbridge Regional Police Service

Performance

A substantial majority of Lethbridge residents (67.4%) believe Lethbridge Regional Police Service is doing a good job policing their community, a slight drop from in 2012 (70.3%). Only a very small number (3.6%) believes LRPS is doing a poor job, while approximately three in ten (29.0%) say the police are performing adequately. A majority of Coaldale residents (59.4%) believe Lethbridge Regional Police Service is doing a good job, down from 2012 (68.5%) but significantly more than the 49.6% who thought similarly in 2007. Only 9.4% of Coaldale residents believe LRPS to be performing poorly.

Meeting Expectations

A clear majority of Lethbridge residents (63.3%) believe LRPS is doing a good job in meeting expectations, down slightly from what was measured in 2012 (68.6%). A majority of Coaldale residents (56.1%) believe LRPS is doing a good job meeting expectations, down from 65.6% in 2012, but up significantly from 2007 (43.3%). Only a very small minority of both Lethbridge (4.6%) and Coaldale (13.2%) residents believe LRPS is doing a poor job meeting expectations.

Changes in Meeting Expectations

Most Lethbridge residents (77.0%) believe LRPS has neither improved nor worsened in meeting expectations in the past year. Of those who believe LRPS has changed in meeting expectations, three times more Lethbridge residents believe LRPS has improved (17.0%) than believe LRPS has gotten worse (6.0%). Most Coaldale residents (72.6%) also state that LRPS has neither improved nor worsened in meeting expectations over the past year. A further 18.4% believe LRPS has improved in meeting expectations while 8.9% believe LRPS has gotten worse.

Attitudes and Behavior of LRPS Officers

The vast majority of Lethbridge residents (87.5%) believe that LRPS officers are polite and respectful when conducting their duties. Approximately one in ten Lethbridge residents believe LRPS officers are somewhat impolite and disrespectful (10.5%) while 2.0% believe they are very impolite and disrespectful. Coaldale residents are almost as likely to believe that LRPS officers are polite and respectful (86.0%) with 14.0% perceiving LRPS officers to be somewhat or very impolite and disrespectful.

Community Safety

Direct Contact with LRPS Officer in Past Year

Slightly less than half of all Lethbridge residents (47.5%) had some direct in-person contact with a LRPS officer over the past year. A similar proportion of Coaldale residents (47.2%) had contact with a LRPS officer in the past year.

Neighborhood Safety

A majority of Lethbridge residents (59.0%) feel very safe in their neighborhoods and a further 35.8% feel somewhat safe. Very few feel somewhat unsafe (4.6%) while fewer still (0.6%) feel very unsafe in their neighborhoods. Two-thirds of Coaldale residents feel very safe in their neighborhoods (67.6%), which is a decline from last year (80.1%). Despite the decline, the overall feelings of safety have increased significantly from 2007. Further, only 1.5% feels somewhat unsafe while no Coaldale resident feels very unsafe.

Downtown Safety

A majority of Lethbridge residents feel somewhat safe (55.6%) while just under one quarter (23.1%) feel very safe downtown. Only about one in five Lethbridge residents do not feel safe downtown, with most of those (18.9%) saying they feel somewhat unsafe. Only 2.3% feel very unsafe when visiting downtown Lethbridge.

Coaldale residents feel more safe when visiting downtown Lethbridge than do Lethbridge residents. Four in five Coaldale residents feel safe in downtown Lethbridge, with 31.1% feeling very safe and a further 50.7% feeling somewhat safe. Less than one-fifth of Coaldale residents feel unsafe in downtown Lethbridge, with most of those feeling somewhat unsafe (13.1%). Only 5.1% feel very unsafe in downtown Lethbridge.

Perceptions of Lethbridge Regional Police Service



Performance

A substantial majority of Lethbridge residents (67.4%) believe Lethbridge Regional Police Service is doing a good job policing their community, a slight drop from in 2012 (70.3%). Only a very small number (3.6%) believes LRPS is doing a poor job, while approximately three in ten (29.0%) say the police are performing adequately.

Within the city of Lethbridge, majorities in all demographic groups provide Lethbridge Regional Police Service with positive evaluations. Women (73.6%), college, technical school and trade program graduates (73.3%), seniors (74.0%), south Lethbridge residents (74.8%) and those least likely to visit downtown (71.4%) are most positive. Men (60.2%), north Lethbridge residents (62.3%), and those most likely to visit downtown are less positive, although still much more positive than negative. Residents who had direct personal contact with a LRPS officer in the past year are just as likely (66.1%) as are those who had no contact (67.9%) to believe the police are doing a good job. Further, only 4.9% of those who had contact believe LRPS is performing poorly, compared to 3.4% of those who had no contact with LRPS in the last year.

A majority of Coaldale residents (59.4%) believe Lethbridge Regional Police Service is doing a good job, down from 2012 (68.5%) but significantly more than the 49.6% who thought similarly in 2007. Only 9.4% of Coaldale residents believe LRPS to be performing poorly.

Meeting Expectations

A clear majority of Lethbridge residents (63.3%) believe LRPS is doing a good job in meeting expectations, down slightly from what was measured in 2012 (68.6%). A majority of Coaldale residents (56.1%) believes LRPS is doing a good job meeting expectations, down from 65.6% in 2012, but up significantly from 2007 (43.3%). Only a very small minority of both Lethbridge (4.6%) and Coaldale (13.2%) residents believe LRPS is doing a poor job meeting expectations.

Within the city of Lethbridge, women (69.9%), south Lethbridge residents (68.8%), seniors (68.1%) and college, technical school and trade program graduates (65.6%) are most likely to believe LRPS is meeting their expectations of what a police service should be doing. Men (55.8%), north Lethbridge residents (56.6%), the youth (58.9%), and those who visit downtown daily (58.4%) are among the least likely to state LPRS is meeting their expectations; however, all of these groups are still much more positive than negative. No statistically significant differences are measured between those who had direct personal contact with a LRPS officer in the past year and those who did not.

Changes in Meeting Expectations

Most Lethbridge residents (77.0%) believe LRPS has neither improved nor worsened in meeting expectations in the past year. Of those who believe LRPS has changed in meeting expectations, three times more Lethbridge residents believe LRPS has improved (17.0%) than believe LRPS has gotten worse (6.0%).

Within the city of Lethbridge, statistically significant differences in opinion are measured between areas of the city, household income, age, and visits downtown. For example, south Lethbridge residents are almost twice as likely (23.0%) to think LRPS has improved as are north (13.9%) and west (13.8%) Lethbridge residents. Other groups that see significant improvement are lower income residents (26.4%), seniors (23.8%) and those who least frequently visit downtown (20.5%). Nearly one in five of those who had contact with LRPS (19.5%) believe they had improved in meeting expectations; two-and-one-half times more than those who had contact and believe LRPS has worsened (7.8%).

Most Coaldale residents (72.6%) also state that LRPS has neither improved nor worsened in meeting expectations over the past year. Twice as many Coaldale residents (18.4%) believe LRPS has improved in meeting expectations than those who think LRPS has gotten worse (8.9%).

Attitudes and Behavior of LRPS Officers

The vast majority of Lethbridge residents (87.5%) believe that LRPS officers are polite and respectful when conducting their duties. Approximately one in ten Lethbridge residents believe LRPS officers are somewhat impolite and disrespectful (10.5%) while 2.0% believe they are very impolite and disrespectful.

All demographic groups within the city of Lethbridge agree by overwhelming majorities that LRPS officers are polite and respectful. Statistically significant differences can be measured within three demographic groups. Men, younger residents, and those who had contact with a LRPS officer in the past year are somewhat less likely than other groups to think LRPS are polite and respectful. But even here it must be noted that all groups are much more likely to think LRPS officers are polite and respectful than to think they are impolite and disrespectful. Similarly, where other sub-group differences are measured, they are slight and those believing LRPS officers to be polite and respectful far outnumber those who think otherwise.

Coaldale residents are almost as likely to believe that LRPS officers are polite and respectful (86.0%) with 14.0% perceiving LRPS officers to be somewhat or very impolite and disrespectful.

Perceptions of Lethbridge Regional Police Service

Direct Contact with LRPS Officer in Past Year

Slightly less than half of all Lethbridge residents (47.5%) had some direct in-person contact with a LRPS officer over the past year. The youth (64.3%) are much more likely than are other age groups to have contact with LRPS officers, especially seniors (26.0%). Upper income residents (58.6%) had more contact than did other residents. Also, those who visit downtown most (57.9%) were much more likely to have had direct contact with a LRPS officer in the past year than were those who visit downtown least (38.4%).

A similar proportion of Coaldale residents (47.2%) had contact with a LRPS officer in the past year.

Neighborhood Safety

For the most part, Lethbridge and Coaldale residents feel very safe in their neighborhoods.

A majority of Lethbridge residents (59.0%) feel very safe in their neighborhoods and a further 35.8% feel somewhat safe. Very few feel somewhat unsafe (4.6%) while fewer still (0.6%) feel very unsafe in their neighborhoods.

Men, seniors, south and west Lethbridge residents, university graduates and upper income residents are most likely to feel safe in their neighborhoods. Women and north Lethbridge residents, while still much more likely to feel safe than unsafe, are slightly less likely to feel very safe in their neighborhoods and slightly more likely than other residents to feel somewhat unsafe.

Two-thirds of Coaldale residents feel very safe in their neighborhoods (67.6%), which is a decline from last year (80.1%). Despite the decline, the overall feelings of safety have increased significantly from 2007. Further, only 1.5% feels somewhat unsafe while no Coaldale resident feels very unsafe.

Downtown Safety

Overall, Lethbridge and Coaldale residents also feel safe in downtown Lethbridge, although less safe than they feel in their own neighborhoods.

A majority of Lethbridge residents feel somewhat safe (55.6%) while just under one quarter (23.1%) feel very safe downtown. Only about one in five Lethbridge residents do not feel safe downtown, with most of those (18.9%) saying they feel somewhat unsafe. Only 2.3% feel very unsafe when visiting downtown Lethbridge.

Women feel slightly less safe when they are downtown than do men. Seniors are more likely than any other age group to feel very safe downtown, while younger residents are the least likely to feel very safe when visiting downtown Lethbridge.

Coaldale residents feel slightly more safe when visiting downtown Lethbridge than do Lethbridge residents. Four of five Coaldale residents feel safe in downtown Lethbridge, with 31.1% feeling very safe and a further 50.7% feeling somewhat safe. Less than one-fifth of Coaldale residents feel unsafe in downtown Lethbridge, with most of those feeling somewhat unsafe (13.1%). Only 5.1% feel very unsafe in downtown Lethbridge.

Frequency of Visits to Downtown Lethbridge

Most Lethbridge residents frequent downtown on a regular basis. Nearly one in five (18.5%) go downtown daily, while a further 45.9% visit downtown on a weekly basis. Nearly one-quarter of Lethbridge residents (23.3%) visits downtown at least monthly, while only 9.0% go downtown infrequently. Men, upper income earners, and university graduates are among those who visit downtown Lethbridge most frequently.

Coaldale residents visit downtown Lethbridge less frequently than do Lethbridge residents. Nevertheless, one-half of all Coaldale residents (50.5%) visit downtown Lethbridge on a weekly basis, and a further 6.7% make daily trips to downtown Lethbridge. Another one-quarter (26.1%) report making monthly visits to downtown Lethbridge while about one in ten (10.8%) report less frequent visits to downtown Lethbridge.
