Methodology

- Population The city of Lethbridge has a total population of 83,960 residents (2008 municipal census) approximately 80% of which are 18 years of age or older (67,168). A total of 41,160 Lethbridge residents are male (49.0%) while 42,800 are female (51.0%). South Lethbridge is home to 29,773 residents (35.5%) while the rapidly expanding west side is now home to 29,673 residents (35.3%). There are 24,514 north Lethbridge residents (29.2%).
- Sample Data were collected by Lethbridge College and Athabasca University students enrolled in STS270 Social Science Research Methods and PSC150 – Local Government in the fall of 2008. Students interviewed 955 adult city of Lethbridge residents by telephone on October 4 and 5, 2008 under the supervision of School of Liberal Arts faculty members Faron Ellis, PhD and Marda Schindeler, MA. Telephone numbers were selected from a sample drawn from InfoCanada directories. We sincerely appreciate and thank all those who took time out of their day to respond to our survey. - Representativeness Analysis of the demographic data indicates that, within acceptable limits, the sample accurately represents the demographic distribution of the adult population within the city of Lethbridge. The sample has been statistically weighted where necessary to even better reflect the demographic distribution of the population (gender, age and area of the city of Lethbridge).
- Confidence The weighted sample yields a margin of error of ± 3.15 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases when analyzing sub-samples of the data.
- IB Commons Call Centre Students conducted interviews using the facilities of the Lethbridge College IB Commons Call Centre and applications developed by the Open Source Learning Lab. - Sponsorship These data are part of a larger study of the opinions and attitudes of Lethbridge residents conducted by the Citizen Society Research Lab at Lethbridge College. This particular set of question was derived from the research interests of College students and faculty.



Social Issues

Same-sex Marriage

A clear majority of Lethbridge residents (60.0%) now support same-sex marriages having equal legal status to traditional marriages. Support for same-sex marriages had almost doubled from only 33.5% in 2002 when we first asked Lethbridge residents about this issue. Women (63.5%), the least religious (73.9%), the youth (72.5%) and those with a university education (67.8%) are most supportive. Religion, age and education remain the most important predictors of opinion on this issue.

Abortion Choice

A substantial majority of Lethbridge residents (78.0%) support a woman's right to choose to have an abortion. Men (79.6%) are just as supportive as are women (76.5%). Furthermore, substantial majorities in most demographic categories also demonstrate strong support. Religion is the most important determent of opinion on this issue with (91.0%) support among the least religious, dropping to only (53.5%) among the most religious.

Capital Punishment

A clear majority of Lethbridge residents (58.7%) support Canada reintroducing capital punishment for people convicted of first degree murder. Support is strongest in north Lethbridge (72.4%), among those with the least amount of formal education (77.0%), older Lethbridge residents and Conservative party supporters (68.8%).

Legal Medical Marijuana

A substantial majority of Lethbridge residents (75.5%) support marijuana being legal for medical purposes. Support is strongest with upper income residents (84.9%), university grads (79.2%), and the youth (83.2%).

Decriminalize Recreational Marijuana

More than one-third of all Lethbridge residents (38.0%) support decriminalizing marijuana for recreational purposes. Support is strongest among men (44.3%), the least religious (46.4%), university grads (43.5%), the youth (47.6%), and among Green (61.6%) and Liberal (57.1%) party supporters.

Legalize Doctor-Assisted Suicide

A majority of Lethbridge residents (61.5%) support making doctor-assisted suicide legal in Canada. Religion is the most important predictor of opinion on this issue with fully three-quarters (75.8%) of those with the least amount of religious participation supportive, dropping to only one-third (33.6%) support among the most religious.
